

What is Vision Zero?





- Vision Zero is a strategy to eliminate all traffic fatalities and severe injuries.
 - The City is committed to eliminating traffic fatalities on City-controlled roads by 2040.
- Vision Zero is <u>not</u> a slogan or aspirational goal. It is a fundamental paradigm shift in our approach to traffic safety.
- Safety prioritized over everything else.







Is Vision Zero Possible?

Yes! Vision Zero is not a utopian vision.

- Multiple U.S. communities have reported zero traffic deaths within the last 5 years
 - Hoboken, NJ (2017-2023)
 - Jersey City, NJ (2022)
 - Alexandria, VA (2023)
 - Knoxville (20??)



How can we reach Zero?

We must completely change how we approach traffic crashes.



TRADITIONAL APPROACH

Traffic deaths are INEVITABLE

PERFECT human behavior

Prevent COLLISIONS

INDIVIDUAL responsibility

Saving lives is **EXPENSIVE**

VISION ZERO APPROACH

Traffic deaths are **PREVENTABLE**

Integrate **HUMAN FAILING** in approach

Prevent **FATAL AND SEVERE CRASHES**



- Federal Grant Projects
- 2023 SS4A
 - A total of \$10 million (80% Federal)
- Planning Projects:
 - Speed Management Plan
 - Bicycle Facilities Plan Update
 - Online public dashboard
 - Follow-up stakeholder engagement
 - Feasibility Studies
 - MUTCD engineering studies
- Construction Projects:
 - Magnolia Ave Improvements (Cherry, Hembree, and Castle)
 - Broadway Streetscapes Project (Cecil to Woodland)
 - Woodland Ave Complete Street Project



What are we doing in the City?

- Federal Grant Projects
- 2024 SS4A
 - A total of \$22.25 million (80% Federal)
- Planning Projects:
 - Safe Routes to School Plan
 - Streetlighting Plan
 - Roadway Safety Audits High Injury Network
- Construction Projects:
 - Chapman Hwy (Blount to Woodlawn/Ft. Dickerson)
 - Shared-use path on the west side of Chapman Hwy
 - Landscaped median
